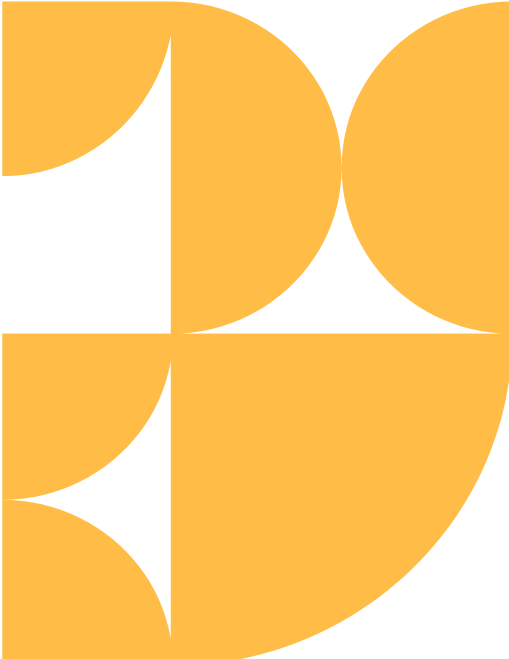

Role Play...Pull Pages... Family Feedback

The 5 Rs:

Rapport
Review
Role Play
Referrals
Reminders

The 3 C's:

Confirm
Complete
Correct

As we begin a new year and enroll new families to HIPPY, we would like to revisit the importance of weekly role plays. The program requires all parents to participate in role-playing before starting a new week's worth of activities with their youngsters. The benefit of using this tool is that modeling each activity prepares parents for the tasks at hand, provides feedback opportunities for parents who may need help explaining the instructions to their children and enhances the parent's confidence in teaching their children the curriculum as intended. There will be a YouTube channel coming soon that goes over the entire role play process, including what the 5R's and 3C's stand for.

Pull Pages and Family Feedback forms are essential to the program. Pull Pages are to be collected every week before role play. Each Home Visitor will tell you what page (from the previous week's activities) they need to collect. This is only for years 1 - 3. Once received, pull pages will go into your child's folder as a part of the State Office's requirements and show your child's participation in the program.

For Little Learners, we use a Family Feedback form that asks detailed questions about specific activities from the week completed, which then goes into your child's folder for the same purpose as the Pull Pages.

For the returning parents, this is just a refresher. For all of the new parents, we realize that the role-play format may not be what you expected and may feel a little silly or redundant sometimes. That is okay. We encourage you to trust the process. HIPPY has been around since the 1980s in the United States and has been successful in over 15 countries and in multiple languages.

If you have questions or comments, please communicate them with your Home Visitor. When the YouTube channel is up and running, your Home Visitor will provide you with the information. HIP-HIP HOORAY FOR HIPPPY!!!

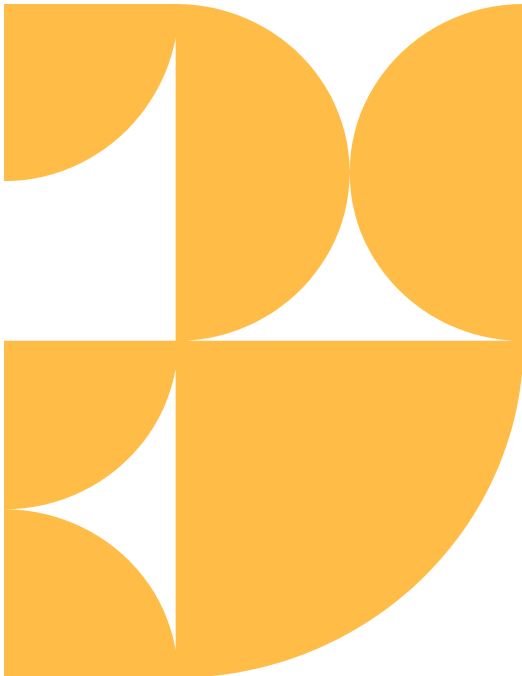
